



Longevity/Site Fidelity for Birds Retrapped in 2008

The long lived Reed Warbler (N592592) shown in the table was ringed as a juvenile in 1999 and was not trapped again until August 2005 (as a breeding male), and then not again until this year.

Long-tailed Tit (0U0554) has been retrapped every year since its original ringing as a juvenile in 2001 – some twenty captures in total.
